FRSC 405-Independent Research Methods

Credits: 3

Offered by Forensic Science Program

This course is designed to allow students to complete an approved independent forensic science research project under the guidance of a faculty mentor. A formal research proposal will be prepared and submitted. In addition to conferring with the instructor regularly regarding the process of their research, students will also be introduced to research and writing methods throughout the course.

Pre-requisite: Completion of 90 credits or permission of instructor; Open only to forensic science majors

Reason for the Modification: Students were confused about the course requirements and curriculum for
this major requirement. Modifications of the title and description have been proposed with more
specific information and the pre-requisite was modified to eliminate erroneous information and specify
that this course is available only to forensic science majors. The addition of one hour of contact time
was established to facilitate a designated time each week in which the faculty coordinator could meet
with the students to discuss research methods and to track student's progress.
