Context: The College of Science's BA requirements have been in place since the split of the College of Arts and Sciences some time ago. We are proposing to streamline these requirements for our BA students.

Specifically: The PHIL/RELI requirement has generally resulted in many students grabbing one of the courses that simultaneously count towards their Mason Core literature requirement (thus negating the impact of the additional requirement). Given this overlap, we are proposing to remove this requirement in its entirety.

The SBS and Non-Western Culture requirements ascribe to a particular definition of breadth that is not necessary the best for all COS BA students. By broadening this requirement to be 2 of several elements within the Mason Core, we aspire to provide students the flexibility to grow in ways they find most useful.

Summary: Restructuring these requirements will maintain the emphasis for the BA on intellectual breadth and provide additional flexibility in the way they meet these educational outcomes.

A three course sequence in American Sign Language (<u>EDSE 115</u> American Sign Language (ASL) I, <u>EDSE 116</u> American Sign Language (ASL) II, and <u>EDSE 219</u> American Sign Language (ASL) III) will also meet the foreign language requirement. Students who are already proficient in a second language may be eligible for a waiver of this requirement. Additional information on waivers can be found at the <u>Office of Academic and Student Affairs</u>.

Non-Western Culture Choose one approved Non-Western Culture Requirement 1 course in addition to the course used to fulfill the Mason Core:Global Understanding requirement. A course used to fulfill the Mason Core:Global Understanding requirement may not be simultaneously used to satisfy this college-level requirement.
